### Opening General Session

**“Making the Most of the Multi-level ABE/GED Classroom”** *Cindy Godby, Instructor, ABE/GED Seminole State College*. Although ABE and GED multi-subject and multi-level classes pose unique challenges for instructors, multiple opportunities exist. This interactive session will focus on instructional strategies and classroom management techniques for making the most of the multi-level classroom. Participants are invited to bring their best practices to share with the group.

**“Classroom Management: How to Do the Dance.”** *Dr. Leo Mediavilla, National trainer, presenter, speaker and former Adult Education Director, Collier County*. This highly interactive session will provide teachers with tools to manage classroom activities and engage students in their learning process.
